Job Opening

The City of Fisher is seeking a full-time (30 hours/week) Public Works Director. The Public Works Director is responsible for maintenance and upkeep of streets, sidewalks, parks, all city buildings, water system, wastewater system and other city infrastructures. Starting wage is based on experience, with a monthly insurance stipend, PERA retirement, vacation and sick leave, and on-call pay. Fisher Volunteer Fire Department

Fire Chief Josh Mailhot would like to remind everyone that recreational burning season is upon us. Before lighting up your fire pit go to [dnr.state.mn.us /forestry/fire/firerating_restrictions.html](http://dnr.state.mn.us/forestry/fire/firerating_restrictions.html) for the current burn restriction status. Campfires cannot be more than 3 feet in diameter by 3 feet high, and the ground (5 feet from the base of the fire) needs to be clear of all combustible material. Also if you are burning more than what can fit inside your backyard firepit, you have to reach out to Josh to get a burn permit. All firepits have to be 25 feet away from any structure and please use the appropriate fire ring. Approved burning materials are fire wood and charcoal. So get out your s'more supplies and enjoy some fresh air! There is nothing like the smell of a bon fire.

Pets (Dogs/Cats)

The city has had a lot of complaints and/or concerns on the following pet issues:

- Picking up feces in a timely manner—Please make sure that you are disposing your pet feces in a sanitary and timely manner. This is an all year round issue.
- Barking—continuous barking for more than three minutes with less than one minute interrupted is a nuisance.
- Licenses-**ALL** dogs and cats must be licensed in the city limits—it is \$10 for three years. This also ensures that if you have an escape artist they will get home safely.
- Running at-large: All dogs and cats need to be leashed and accompanied by a person that can control the animal. Also they need to be either tied up, in a kennel or in a fenced in yard.
- Vaccinations—all dogs and cats in the city limits must be vaccinated for Rabies and Distemper by a licensed veterinarian.
